Paul's Ponderings

Sunday, June 28 we included this PRAYER FOR CHANGE in the service.

Almighty God, change is bittersweet. In order to change we are forced both to leave something behind and to embrace something new. Grant us the grace on this day to do both with humility. Help us affirm the good things of our past as we lean into a future where there will also be good things.

As we contemplate the changes that will come, remind us that all good things come from you. Today we commit ourselves to the necessary work ahead. Be present with us, work in us and through us, we pray. Amen. (from Worship & Song, No. 198)

While it is true the church is called to be dynamic and constantly changing, we as individuals had better be constantly changing, too. Some times change is selected, optional and fun. Other times change is forced upon us and only reluctantly and begrudgingly do we accept the 'new thing.' Whether chosen or imposed, it is a reality that change comes to each and every person. Much of the blessing of it is dependent on our attitude toward the idea of change...

Debbie Holloway writes at Crosswalk.com, where this interesting piece was found after the Supreme Court ruling which overturned state bans on same-sex marriages. That ruling caused some people to be all up-in-arms, but Holloway took a more Christ-centered approach:

"I'm convinced that God's love for [hu]mankind cannot be limited or defined by our culture and we will continue to look for ways to love people," she writes. "This decision may change Christianity in America. But I believe it needs to change."

She goes on to give rationale for why American Christianity "needs to" change:

We are too comfortable in our easy faith.

We are too concerned about our neighbor's sin when our own is glaring.

We need less comfort for self and more concern for others.

We need to spend less and give more.

We need to cling to the Cross instead of fear.

We need less of us, more of Him.

She then reminds us that "overruling gay marriage bans was hardly the only thing that happened on Friday, June 26, 2015:

Children lost parents, little girls were raped, men were beheaded, the poor faced another hungry night, women faced unspeakable oppression and innocent blood ran in the streets, while racial hate crimes and tension continue to divide our country. We might have paused to read a headline or shuddered at the atrocities our neighbors are facing, and then gone about our normal life. I'm convinced if Christians spent half as much time praying for those suffering as we do arguing with those we don't agree with, the Church would be stronger and our world would be a different place.

So what has she decided to do today? **To spend less time arguing, and more time on living the Great Commission.** Hmmm, not a bad idea!¹

UMCOR Health Kits

The Missions team is highlighting the UMCOR Health Kit in this month's newsletter. Health Kits help disaster victims reclaim their dignity and self-respect. When people can maintain personal hygiene, their overall health improves. Here's a list of items in the Health Kit:

- 1 new hand towel (15" X 25" up to 17" x 27")
- 1 bath size bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz or larger)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (NO child-sized toothbrushes)
- 1 new washcloth
- 6 band aids (3/4")
- 1 large, sturdy comb (not pocket-size)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clipper (NO emery boards or toenail clippers)
- Add \$1 to purchase toothpaste

Lay out hand towel and lay wash cloth flat in the center. Place rest of items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Fold one end of towel so it covers all items. Grasp bundle of items and roll over rest of towel tightly. Place tightly rolled bundle in Ziploc bag.

If you'd like a copy of the Thanksgiving Ingathering brochure, an up-dated brochure is available at the back of the sanctuary or the church office. **The Dedication of Ingathering kits will be held on Sunday, November 1st so all kits must be turned in by that date. Our goal is to collect 120 kits this year. The Ingathering will be held on Saturday, November 7.**

Work Trip Up-date

Thanks to all who supported the missions work team! By staying in our own beds each night and doing our work close to home, we had many more people help out. We had many people praying for us and providing snacks and meals all week. Those who participated in the work experience appreciated all the TLC. Your financial support, prayers, encouragement, food donations all helped to make the week an enjoyable experience. We worked 2 days at Mission of Hope serving over 150 meals each day and completed several projects they had for us. In Tipton, we served meals & played games with kids at the park, got a garage painted, washed a few windows and completed numerous projects at the church. The garage was cleaned, the youth room and education supply room traded spaces and are in the process of getting up-dated, and landscaping in back of the church is underway.

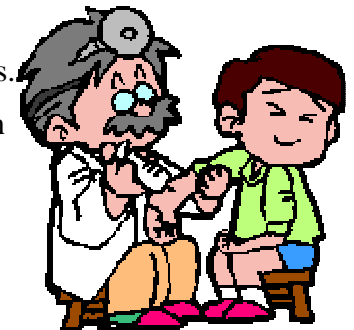

Homeless Ministry

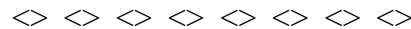
The Street Team is a homeless ministry of [The Center](#) at [St. John's United Methodist Church in Davenport](#). Designed to meet the basic needs of homeless people in their area, they collect and pass out health kits, hygiene kits, blankets, and packaged food.

Last year a local study by [Community Health Care, Inc.](#) of the Quad Cities found that shelters in Scott County are housing 220 people, including families, each month. Even with 210 shelter beds available, ten to twelve people per month are turned away because the facilities have reached their capacity. An estimated 47 homeless persons are not receiving any services at all.

The unsheltered clients of the Street Team live in parks, under bridges, on the riverfront, in cars, behind dumpsters, and in building nooks and crannies. Because many people struggle with addictions or mental illness, homeless outreach is often the only way some will consider seeking shelter services.

The personal contact of ministry participants makes a huge difference in the lives of homeless individuals. George, for instance, in a video interview on the ministry's website said, "If they weren't around, I guarantee I wouldn't be surviving out here."

Apportionment gifts from United Methodist churches throughout Iowa help to support this homeless ministry. Praise God, Tipton 1st UMC!!!



LITTLE FRIENDS UPDATE

MAKE DISCIPLES of Jesus Christ...

Those are the first words of our church's mission statement, which continues ... for the transformation of the world. How do we form disciples in the unique context of the Wesleyan tradition?

First of all, in Wesleyan theology and experience, conversion is not a one-time event but an ongoing process of transformation into the likeness of Christ. John Wesley called this "the holy life." We don't just "get saved" and wait to go to heaven. God's love and grace are continually at work in our lives in a dynamic process by which we grow toward "maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ." (Ephesians 4:13) This process is grounded in the Wesleyan understanding of prevenient, justifying and sanctifying grace.

Secondly, John Wesley was a leader and organizer who formed the followers around specific disciplines by which "the people call Methodist" would continue to grow in the love of God. These disciplines varied somewhat by period and location, but generally included 1) study of scripture and a variety of spiritual and religious classics; 2) devotional piety practiced through meditation, self-examination, prayer, and bible reading and, 3) social outreach, particularly engagement with the poor, the disadvantaged, children, and the imprisoned.

Following the directives of the Healthy Church Initiative, the Neighbors & Disciples Team has been working on a "Discipleship Pathway" that will seek to mimic the results of John Wesley's early leadership. Much prayer, study and reading has gone into the work so far. We invite your prayers as this Pathway is nearly ready to be presented.
