CHANGE A CHILD'S STORY GIVE BOOKS. GIVE TIME.

One million books and a million hours of reading with children – that's the goal of Iowa United Methodists in the next two years in a new initiative called, "Change a Child's Story".

The academic and economic futures of almost 90,000 young Iowans are at risk.

In 2012, roughly 1 in 4 Iowa fourth-graders scored below a proficient level on the state reading test. Research indicates that a quarter of kids who are behind in reading by the 4th grade will eventually drop out of school, making them more likely to experience other hardships, including jail time.

55% of Iowa children under age six whose low-income parents don't have a high school diploma.

86% of children with parents who didn't graduate from high school live in low-income families.

61% of children in poverty don't have children's books at home.

Sadly, Iowa's kids are not all developing the reading skills they need for success.

Bishop Trimble is challenging every UMC church in Iowa to get involved in *Change a Child's Story* and wanting our church to make a difference in children's lives right here in Cedar County. Currently, our church is in the process of identifying individuals who are excited about this initiative and interested in planning how our church might be involved. **Interested? Contact Pastor Paul or the church office by September 5.**

Melinda Stonebraker thought of the Vision Statement when she read the following devotional for July 6:

Unselfish Roots

(Upper Room devotional; Mon, July 6th, 2015)

Let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds.
— Hebrews 10:24 (NRSV)

One June day, my husband and I decided to visit a nearby historic home. The beautiful house lay nestled behind a long driveway lined with live oak trees. My husband and I sat in rocking chairs on the house's veranda and listened to the tour guide share the history of the estate. She then began to talk about the uniqueness of the live oak tree. "When live oak trees are planted together in a row," she said, "their roots not only intertwine but fuse together. This interdependent root system allows the live oaks to share water and nutrients and to form a stronger hold in the ground." She told us that when a hurricane had swept through that area, their live oaks sustained little damage because they were held strongly together in the earth.

What would happen if Christians held as tightly together through the hurricanes of this life as those live oak trees did? What if we poured the strength, wisdom, and love that God has rained down on us into the lives of those experiencing hardship? What if we received that same strength, wisdom, and love from others when we ourselves are going through trials? God did not design us to live unto ourselves but created us to be a family, firmly bound together by our roots in our Creator.

We do seek to be providing value to people through worship, small groups, challenges, and mission. But the fact is, we can't take the first step for someone. You need to do that. As this school year begins, many opportunities for growth also begin anew. It's a great time for groups to welcome new participants; and it's a great time for someone only marginally involved [or not at all!] to consider dipping a foot to check the possibilities. UMCOR Health Kits

The Missions team is highlighting the UMCOR Health Kit in this month's newsletter. Health Kits help disaster victims reclaim their dignity and self-respect. When people can maintain personal hygiene, their overall health improves. Here's a list of items in the Health Kit:

- 1 new hand towel (15" X 25" up to 17" x 27")
- 1 bath size bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz or larger)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (NO child-sized toothbrushes)
- 1 new washcloth
- 6 band aids (3/4")
- 1 large, sturdy comb (not pocket-size)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clipper (NO emery boards or toenail clippers)
- Add \$1 to purchase toothpaste


Lay out hand towel and lay wash cloth flat in the center. Place rest of items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Fold one end of towel so it covers all items. Grasp bundle of items and roll over rest of towel tightly. Place tightly rolled bundle in Ziploc bag.


GET A BUDDY, BUILD A KIT

It’s interesting that one of the classifications with much turn-over are those which coordinate participation. In other words, coordinators frequently have expressed getting tired of the whining.

For this I must apologize. As your pastor, I have failed to be clear:

**There are expectations of those who profess to be christian,

If a person is going to grow as a christian and as a person, eventually you take responsibility. Can you imagine someone being part of a high school volleyball team or football team and when the coach says, “You’re in!” that they would say, “but coach, I just came to sit on the bench. I don’t want to play.” Yet we have many people associated with this church who must have that same attitude. Being a Christian is not a spectator activity; and the church of Jesus Christ cannot carry the mission with out the participation of the people who have the ability to serve.

Grief is our natural response to loss; and loss is part of life. Therefore, grief is inevitable. Mourning is the active work of dealing with that grief. Mourning can be a work we set out to do, by learning and practicing mourning skills. OR, mourning can carve it’s own gorge through our emotions and relationships, eroding whatever is in its way. Our culture isn’t very tooled for mourning. In fact, mourning is not encouraged. People are supposed to ‘be over it’ by the time bereavement leave is exhausted.

Now I’ve read a couple articles suggesting that a helpful element for the treatment of PTSD might be intentional grief-work. We do a good job of ingraining the idea that we’re tough and it doesn’t matter what happens to us or to those around us, but trauma and even death have a way of carving their own gorge. That may be experienced in what behavioral treatment people call Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

Jesus was authentic. The Bible reports a time he was sad and, “Jesus wept.” But it’s hard to always be a person who identifies and appropriately expresses emotions. Do not assume that you or loved ones are born with the coping tools, techniques and abilities to mourn the losses of life. And, don’t think that time [alone] will make it all better! LITTLE FRIENDS

One of the original purposes of the **Education Wing 51** years ago was to reach into the community with a pre-school. This will be the 50th year for hosting Little Friends Preschool. It is gratifying and glorifying to have the facilities used Monday-Friday mornings and afternoons, AND it is one way to provide a gentle introduction to young families!! We now own Little Friends. That means... We have more opportunity to provide assistance, support and nurture to the students and families. One way we can begin is by helping host their "Meet & Greet" Thursday evening, September 3. Parents will be bringing in stacks of forms to be received and will be signing up for parent-tasks. We'll need registration assistance and, also, we will provide light refreshments for the children and their parents. Contact the office if you hear your name in this 'call.'

CHRISTIAN FORMATION is the purpose of the church. As I write this, the evening prior to the newsletter deadline, we have four solid teachers for the Pre-school-through high school Sunday morning classes. Additionally, we have three persons who have said they could assist or substitute.

YOU CAN teach a children's SS class!! We have been successful in the past having sufficient numbers of teachers that if someone wanted to teach alternate Sundays or months that we could do that. To allow for that we need additional participation. And if it's not you, then WHO?

If you're interested in teaching/helping/subbing in Pre-School through 6th grade contact Gail Fleming. For teaching Middle school through High school ("youth") contact Pastor Paul. (See article concerning Youth SS plans! You can create an elective for a 4-week run, and then go back to your own class!)

YOUTH : WEDNESDAY NIGHTS

We would like to meet once per month as a Youth Group of grades 5-12, the first Wednesday of every month (with the exception of September – meet 1st and last Wed's to make up for missed meeting Homecoming week). The dates we are planning are: 9/2, 9/30, 11/4, 12/2, 1/6, 2/3, 3/2, 4/6, 5/4.

We would begin at 5:30 p.m. with a meal until 6:15 p.m. This would allow kids to go straight from after school practice to Youth Group. The schedule each month would be as follows:

5:30 – 6:15 p.m. = Meal

6:15 – 6:30 p.m. = Message

6:30 – 8 p.m. = Fun Activity (tied to the message)

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We would like to explore a wild and crazy format for youth Sunday morning. We're calling it "Sunday Elective." Here's how it will work... We'll create a list or catalogue (think school or college course catalogue) of possible courses to be offered for a specified number of weeks, let's say four. The youth, grades 7– 12, sign up for the class they wish to take. At the end of that session, we might take a week to re-group but they can begin the next session of 4 or 5 or 6 weeks after that. They will never know for sure who else will be in their class; and this will allow for a wide variety of teachers, too.

Electives might be as wide-ranging as creating a sermon-length drama; preparing a couple songs as a chime choir; studying a particular book of the Bible or a theme; it could be kind of academic like church history; or watch a movie and consider the message/s conveyed. We could have guest teachers come in from the community, and Iowa Religious Media has a crazy amount of video-based curriculum and now offers streaming videos, too.

This concept is new; we don't know of any other church doing this model of Sunday morning programming. So it's a work in progress. If you want to be on the front-end of an exciting ministry, talk to Pastor Paul.



SAFE SANCTUARY

We've been a bit remiss and shallow on following some of the safeties of it, but I believe Jen can lead us to higher water...*

Jen Johnson will be holding a **Safe Sanctuary training session** on Wed. Sept. 2nd at 6:30 p.m. at the church. The training will be less than an hour and if you need child care, please let the Church Office or Jen know. (Specific room to be determined). "Do I need to be trained??" you may be asking yourself. The answer is YES if you plan on working with the youth at our church...in Sunday School, Youth Groups, the Nursery, Choir Kids... the list is endless. We realize there is a conflict so we'll be scheduling another class just for youth.)
