"I ask you not to become discouraged by what I'm suffering for you, which is your glory. ¹⁴ This is why I kneel before the Father. ¹⁵ Every ethnic group in heaven or on earth is recognized by him. ¹⁶ I ask that he will strengthen you in your inner selves from the riches of his glory through the Spirit. ¹⁷ I ask that Christ will live in your hearts through faith. As a result of having strong roots in love, ¹⁸ I ask that you'll have the power to grasp love's width and length, height and depth, together with all believers. ¹⁹ I ask that you'll know the love of Christ that is beyond knowledge so that you will be filled entirely with the fullness of God. ²⁰ Glory to God, who is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine by his power at work within us; ²¹ glory to him in the church and in Christ Jesus for all generations, forever and always. Amen. (Ephesians 3:13-21 CEB)

Growth & Impact Groups (GIGs) are one of the ways the church has, historically, helped people live deep and wide. The founder of Methodism, John Wesley, knew that to be vital and growing disciples, people needed to be in relational groups so he placed them in what he called "Societies." Call them what you wish, we each need relationships that challenge, encourage, support and companion us to be fruitful for God's kingdom.

RESOLUTION idea: Consider renewed worship habits. Rather than thinking of worship as something we do when it's comfortable, convenient or familiar to us, what about focusing on the praise of God and just coming to worship?! In fact, the very idea of worship is based on sacrifice. Somehow much of American Christianity (or religiosity?) has come to expect worship to be self-serving instead of God-pleasing! What kind of different world could we make if we thought of life as an opportunity to give instead of get-what's-in-it-for-me?!

THANK YOU every one who contributed to making your church more inviting and hospitable, especially during December when some folks may arrive who are not as comfortable or familiar with what we do here.

THANK YOU to musicians young and old, rookies and veterans who contributed your talents to making worship meaningful and affective.

THANK YOU to all who quietly serve without needing to be asked or cajoled, who see opportunities and assume the role.

Here's a question that's been asked: "Why isn't every member just assigned their time to usher, greet, read, host...?" Shared Blessings Meals

THANK YOU to all who helped with Shared Blessings in 2015. We appreciate your help and hope you experienced the blessing of serving others in our community. It's our prayer that "community" happens both in the dining area **and** the kitchen!

January will begin the 7th year! The meals will continue to be served from 11:00 a.m. to Noon on the second, fourth, and fifth Saturdays each month.

We have several community groups who help regularly with Shared Blessings meals. When community groups serve the meals, we need one person from our church to serve as a "coordinator" or "host" for the meal. The "coordinator" or "host" helps groups navigate the kitchen, answers questions and gives guidance for meal preparation and clean-up. If that task sounds overwhelming, ask a friend to do it with you. (Those who are experienced will also be happy to provide training.)

The sign-up sheets for 2016 calendar are located in the Gathering Place. Please consider volunteering – it's a great way to meet new friends or invite a group of friends, committee/SS class/Circle/GIG or another small group sign up for a meal or two.

Many volunteer opportunities are available. If you are interested in helping cook or with meal preparation, we do some food prep ahead of time and the rest during the early (9:00-11:00) shift. If you are interested in serving, clean-up, and interacting with those who come to Shared Blessings, sign up for the late (11:00-1:00) shift. We also need people to drive the bus, deliver meals to "homebound" folks, and provide "hospitality or friendship" by simply eating and talking with our guests. Whether you volunteer or join us for a meal, you'll discover the blessings of reaching out and sharing a meal with friends, neighbors and strangers in our community.

Leaving a Legacy Campaign

The goal of this financial campaign is to more than triple Edie Ford's bequest of \$31,227.27 to equal \$100,000. Fifty percent of the funds will be used for vital building projects, such as installing handicapaccessible automated doors for the breezeway entrance and repairing the sagging front steps. Twenty-five percent of funds will add to the church's endowment. Fifteen percent of funds will enhance ministry planning through developing lay leaders, completing the gathering room, and as seed for emerging ministries. Ten percent of funds will be spent on children's ministry, such as outdoor play equipment and resources for children to utilize during church.

Our goal is to reach \$100,000 by April 17, 2016. More information on how to follow in the footsteps of Edie Ford will be shared in upcoming newsletters and worship services.

FINANCES AND FAITH:

An advertisement in Christianity Today by a leading seminary pictured stacks of money and piles of coins under the heading, "It's put more Christians at the stake than Nero." The ad went on to state, "Throughout history, countless Christians have fallen victim to the power of money. So if you're struggling to find the balance between finance and faith, remember this: Real security is not a matter of what's in your pockets, but who's in your heart."

That's good advice, isn't it? Real security — Godgiven security — comes not from money or alarm systems, but from God and God alone. But the difficulty in finding the balance between finance and faith extends far beyond that seminary or its advertising. Every family, every person must be diligent or, at least in our culture, we will fall prey to being in the grasp of the 'Financial god.' That is true for those who have much; and it is also true for those who have little. There is no pleasing that Financial god. Attitudes, covetousness, fear, miserliness (think Scrooge!) can put a veil over even the brightest times, events, relationships and possibilities.

It's been estimated that 2,350 times the Bible gives advice how to live freely, not chained by finances. The most cited biblical method is to think first of others, then to learn to live on the remainder. This is called "First Fruits."

Help Craft Tipton UMC's Online Presence

You don't need to read the newsletter to know that Americans are spending more and more time online. There are points that can be made for why time spent online is good and why it is bad. The Church is called to the work of redemption of the world, wherever the world is. Your church has a website and a facebook account, but neither are routinely updated. We need people from our church to help make our online presence one that is useful as a tool in the work of the Church. Give Online

Who: Anyone wanting to give who has a bank account, credit card, or debit card.

Don't forget the discipleship pathway

January is as good a time as any to pause and think about where you've been and where you're going. In September we introduced the Discipleship Pathway Self-Assessment, which can be obtained from the church office or the church website, tiptonumc.org. The self-assessment is intended to help a person see where he or she is currently and indicate some steps toward spiritual maturity. Ideally, this effort is supported by other people in a GIG (Growth and Impact Group) or partnership of some sort.

Perhaps this self-assessment, or this whole idea of discipleship pathway is too vague and you'd like more specifics. This month we'll start at the top, in the Deeply Rooted section, with Prayer and Meditation. What is prayer and meditation? Prayer is talking to God, and doesn't have to be "off the cuff". Prayer includes acknowledging God's attributes and power, expressing thanks for gifts and provision received, confession of sin, and asking for help for a variety of needs. Meditation includes quietness, solitude, and thinking about and listening to God.

Why are these disciplines beneficial? Prayer and meditation help us focus on what is important and true. Through prayer we can remind ourselves that God is loving and good (and powerful, just, compassionate, etc), accept the grace and forgiveness God offers, and cast our anxiety on the One who cares for us (1 Peter 5:7). Sometimes our lives seem too busy to pray. Our calendars overwhelm us and we lose focus. Through prayer, especially when we are busy, we begin to allow our focus to change toward God's focus: the redemption of the world (John 3:17). With that focus, we see how God is present with us and can work through us in the events of our daily lives.

How do I get started? There are lots of ways to pray. Maybe the simplest is to find a place, maybe while still in bed or on the drive to work, to take a few moments to talk to God. Other ideas are on the GIG page on our website (under the Worship tab).

The bottom line: "Pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) may seem intimidating, but the important thing is to start somewhere and start now. Harnish quotes Henri Nouwen saying "discipleship cannot be realized without discipline". The discipline of prayer and meditation requires effort and should be practiced by all of us. Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. To that end, we are here to help one another on the journey. A GIG can help support you. Please let me know if you want to join.

Women and Men, Retired or Working Ministry Opportunity

Want to help people when it is most appreciated? Want to know the pure deep-down joy of generosity? There's a way for YOU to be part of the funeral ministry. Sure, persons are needed the day & time of the funeral to work. If you're employed or otherwise engaged, that's not possible, but you can still offer desserts and/or salads. (Often the "main course" is now catered.)

You realize that sometimes the window is fairly narrow between the time a funeral is scheduled and when all arrangements need to be in place. It will assist the work if the coordinators, Lois Salmonson and Mary Wright have an up-to-date list to work off. Could you let Lois (886-2315, <u>SRON263@aol.com</u>) or the church office know what roles you would be willing to fill. Obviously, not one of us can say we will "always" be available and able to assist. Here are some of the ways you might help:

- Preparations: food, setting tables, dishing up desserts, sometimes moving furniture too
- Serving and Clean-up (always helpful to have a co-ed group for some of these tasks, from pouring coffee to doing dishes!)
- Providing dessert or salad (can get around most work schedules)
- Provide hospitality in the Gathering Place for family; usually just coffee and a cold drink; answer questions
- be a resource person
- Run the technology during the service
- Usher and assist the funeral directors
