Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Between Sundays ~ Thoughts from Pastor Jenny

Each morning I make every effort to spend at least 15-30 minutes in prayer, study and contemplation. Full disclosure though, I have done poorly for the past 3 months. Travel, family visits, and transitioning to a new church have made it more difficult to focus on my own personal walk with Christ. As your pastor, I owe it to you to pause from the to-do list, and spend quality time with the Lord. By taking time daily, I am better prepared to handle the various aspects of pastoral ministry.

I am committed to the ministry of the church, and I take my call to be your pastor very seriously. That said, if I am not careful, I will give too much of myself to you, leaving little for Christ, myself, and my family. It's important that I set healthy boundaries in ministry and in my personal life. In the past I have not always been so good at balancing ministry and family life. I hope to do better while serving as your pastor.

One of my favorite authors is Henri Nouwen, a Catholic priest who wrote about how people are called to live a spiritual life. One of Nouwen's last books published was *The Inner Voice of Love: A Journey Through Anguish to Freedom*. Nouwen writes of his own inner struggles and shares how to "Set Boundaries to Your Love." Here is a portion of this passage in his book:

"Part of your struggle is to set boundaries to your own love-something you have never done. You give whatever people ask of you, and when they ask for more, you give more, until you find yourself exhausted, used, and manipulated. Only when you are able to set your own boundaries will you be able to acknowledge, respect, and even be grateful for the boundaries of others." (pg. 9, *The Inner Voice of Love*)

As your pastor I will seek ways to equip you, the saints, to fulfill the mission of this church—"To Make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the

world." I will strive to prepare and preach relevant, Bible-based sermons while serving alongside gifted worship leaders. I will partner with you to provide quality pastoral care when folks are in crisis or illness, in need, and are seeking ways to connect with the Lord. I will help leaders to shepherd children, youth and adults in their discipleship with Christ. I will support and guide the mission and outreach ministries of the church, at times working alongside servants of the ministries. I will likely do more, but I see these areas as a great starting place for us as partners in ministry.

I will do all this (and probably more) by setting healthy boundaries with my time. Notice that I didn't say I would do the ministry, but that I will support YOU as you are in ministry. Healthy churches seek ways to help all people to use their gifts to bring people into relationship with the Lord, not just the pastor and key leaders in the church.

As your pastor, one who does not live in Tipton, I will still be available to you in times of crisis, and there are those in town who can provide care and support until I arrive. I will strive to attend the events that allow me to work alongside you in the ministries of the church, and of those in the community. As I formulate my schedule each week, I try to bundle as much as I can, making my drive to Tipton as fruitful as I can for ministry.

Please know that you may contact me if you have concerns about the ministry of the church or your own particular pastoral care. My office hours most days are 10:00 am to 2:00 pm Monday thru Thursday (although when there are evening meetings, I won't be in until after noon.) Please stop by so we can get to know one another better. Friday is my day off, and with Saturday, I get a weekend. Know that I am still available for emergencies on Friday and Saturday.

UMCOR Health Kits

The Missions team is highlighting the UMCOR Health Kit in this month's newsletter. Health Kits help disaster victims reclaim their dignity and self-respect. When people can maintain personal hygiene, their overall health improves. Here's a list of items in the Health Kit:

- 1 new hand towel (15" X 25" up to 17" x 27")
- 1 bath size bar of soap in wrapper (3 oz or larger)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed wrapper (NO child-sized toothbrushes)
- 1 new washcloth
- 6 band-aids (3/4")
- 1 large, sturdy comb (not pocket-size)
- 1 nail file or fingernail clipper (NO emery boards or toenail clippers)
- Add \$1 to purchase toothpaste

Lay out hand towel and lay wash cloth flat in the center. Place rest of items on top of washcloth. Fold sides of towel to cover items. Fold one end of towel so it covers all items. Grasp bundle of items and roll over rest of towel tightly. Place tightly rolled bundle in Ziploc bag.

2016-2017 Confirmation Journey for 7th-12th Graders

All youth grades 7-12 who have not been confirmed are invited to join Pastor Jenny and other adults to learn about their faith through the confirmation journey. It is not a membership class, but instead the beginning of (or continuation of) a personal journey of faith. This is best accomplished by building relationships with other youth, adult mentors, parents, and leaders. In a variety of settings, youth will have the opportunity to explore their faith in a judgment-free atmosphere. There is no “end” to the faith journey, only a completion of the confirmation process. Each youth will have the opportunity to claim this faith journey as their own on a confirmation Sunday in September 2017.

The confirmation journey will begin on Sunday, September 11, at 9:00 am with a parent and youth meeting in the youth room. At this meeting, the confirmation expectations will be explained. Some key dates to note are:

Sundays — 9:00-10:15 am — Confirmation Class; Sept. 11 start date
Early Out Wednesdays — 1:30 pm — Field Trip and Mission Days: Sept. 21, Oct. 19, Nov. 16, Jan. 18, Feb. 15, March 22, April 19

In addition, there will be a confirmation retreat, visits to other faith traditions, and the opportunity to go on a mission trip.


Choir Kids & Kids For Christ (KFC)
