In the book <u>Five Practices of a Fruitful Congregation</u> author Robert Schnase, who is also the author of our Lent study book, lists five tangible activities that every person of a church can do to encourage a church's fruitfulness. The first one he lists is "Radical Hospitality."

Perhaps the most well-known Bible passage on the topic is from Hebrews 13:2: Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Perhaps you can relate to that passage, from not only the perspective of offering a place in a storm but perhaps you were the "stranger" welcomed in.

Another scripture is similar, and is recorded in Romans 12:13: *Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers*. This verse tells us our benefit and well-being is connected to every one around us. This reminds one of the Lord's instructions to the people of the exile who were carried off to Babylon. In Jeremiah 29:7 & 12 we are reminded of that connection upon which we are all and each dependent:

But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the LORD on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.... For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.

I could write more about the scriptural understanding of "hospitality," but I learned a lot about it as I happened to be hanging around in Christopher & Banks at the Coralville Mall a while back. One of the salespersons was working in the rear storage & staging room so the door to that area was open. I meandered to that corner and just inside the door was a large poster with their "Sales Techniques." I don't recall how many there were, but it seems there were at least seven. The first was this: "Establish eye contact with every Friend within 15 seconds after entering the store." One of the middle ones mentioned building trust. The last one was simple and brief: "Invite her back." (To this sexist comment I did not take offense, but it wouldn't hurt if they invited the purse-carriers/jacket-holders back, too!!)

Is EVANGELISM as simple as "with every Friend, establish eye-contact within 15 minutes after they enter the church?" If so, it seems within the realm of possibility that we can each do that!! Ok, maybe not as well as Jesus could spot a needy person in a pile of people, but we can at least make eye-contact!

And I have no doubt most people have practiced, in some realm, the act of inviting someone to return – to our house, to a game, to the park, <u>some</u>where. Hmmm, we could invite a person to return the following week to worship.

The Cedar Rapids Gazette has this new section referring to the "creative corridor." The "creative" has a couple different referents, one of which is creating jobs. But nearly every week in the Sunday edition it also has an article or two about the importance of welcoming a diverse population into the area. In the Feb. 23rd guest column, Helen Jameson wrote:

With inclusion we will have creative ideas and solutions, new businesses coming and staying, an expanded work force and bolstered economic development. Perhaps most important, we will be preparing our children for the ever-changing demographics of the 21st century.

The Bible had a handle on all this way before Economic Development groups did! God is so varied that none of us can hold within a single skin or experience all the complexity of God. So God made us to need one another. Maybe we're starting to catch on???

Missions Work Trip – July 14-18

The REGISTRATION DEADLINE is SUNDAY, April 13, 2014. Anyone (14 and above) intending to go on this work trip MUST complete a registration form and turn it in to the church office with a \$75 registration fee. We'll be assisting with tornado recovery work in Washington, IL July 14-16 and working in Tipton July 17-18. In Tipton, we're hoping to re-roof a house, plus an assortment of other projects close to home. If you've never been a part of a work trip or haven't had construction experience, no need to worry. All skill levels and abilities are welcome – there will be something for you to do.

The plan is to stay in Washington, IL from Monday through Wednesday, then stay in our own beds and work in Tipton on Thursday and Friday. If you're interested in working only on July 17 and/or July 18, please complete a registration form and \$15 per day by the April 13th deadline.

Nurturing Faith -24/7

"It is through our everyday relationship with our children that we convey spirituality. As we share our reverence for the natural world, the simple joys of family life, our dependability, and our unconditional love, we show them the face of God." Jean Grasso Fitzpatrick

To nurture faith in your family this next month, here are some things you may want to try:

- Read the Easter story aloud. Start a family tradition of reading aloud the different aspects of the Easter story starting on Maundy Thursday (April 17). Have family members take turns by reading: Matthew 26:17-30 on Maundy Thursday, Matthew 27:27-61 on Good Friday, Matthew 27:62-66 on Saturday and Matthew 28:1-10 on Easter Sunday.
- Have a religious Easter egg hunt. Consider having an egg hunt that has eggs with religious symbols inside. Hide eggs with Easter symbols, such as nails (John 20:24-29), a stone (Matthew 28:2), an angel (Matthew 28:5-7), a cross (Matthew 27:32), a ripped piece of cloth and/or a broken stone (Matthew 27:51), thorns from a rose bush (Matthew 27:29), etc. After children find all the eggs and open them up, have them guess the significance of each item. If they are unsure, have them look up the scripture passage that can give them insight about each symbol.
- As you listen to the news or read the newspaper, make note of individuals, issues, countries, etc. in need of prayer. Select one or two items to discuss with your family and include it during your family prayer time.

After 3:00 the Team finalizes their report, which includes some things we may be doing well and showing fruits; and relates some areas for us to work on so we might become more healthy. These are called "prescriptions." The Team shares the Report with the Pastor, who runs copies to be given to the congregation the next morning.

27th (Sunday)

- Lead Consultant preaches. Right after worship, copies of the Report are handed out and the Lead reads the report.
- There are three "Open Forums" scheduled at various times, at which people will have opportunity to discuss the Report and prescriptions.
- Within 30 days after the Consultation, a Church Conference is held with the Conference Superintendent. The only agenda item is to vote on the prescriptions – 'all or none.'

~ June 1: If we approve the prescriptions, we begin to 'take the medicine!'

On another front: Progress Continues... FORWARD IN FAITH !!

March 17-19 new windows were installed in the Education Wing. That was one of the items on the 2007 'to -do list' created by the Long-Range Facilities Planning Team composed of Barb Rickard, Glenn Eaton, Brad Kirkpatrick and Ken McKay. These new windows have an energy seal and should be much cooler [summer] and warmer [winter.] as of this writing we have received \$7,265 for these windows. Total cost is \$13,000 so if you are able to give toward this project, whatever amount, it will be appreciated – not just today but every cold day for years and years by God's children from the smallest to the tallest.

Now we are down to the last item on the Long-Range's project list, updating the Fellowship Room and making it more user-friendly. When the Long Range Team evaluated the facilities, they got to this space and wondered why it was not more frequently utilized. It wasn't hard to figure that out: it wasn't insulated; the hating system was poor; no AC; windows were porous; no close bathroom; no hospitality center for coffee or anything; no TLC for about four decades.

We have been addressing these deficiencies, from 2007 insulation to the new roof in 2008, to the new heating system in 2010 that included a separate air-handler for the Fellowship Room, and even to the new windows in 2013, this room is moving toward one of the most inviting and comfortable spaces in the building.

Michael Nissen, a carpenter who is relatively new to town, is working with volunteers to bring plumbing and finishing touches to the Fellowship Room. Steve Person and Dusty Johnson have been working on demolition and have now begun construction. There will be an accessible rest room in a corner of the Fellowship Room, near a small kitchenette that will be appropriate for hosting a small group. And if you've 'set the Table' for communion, there will be <u>no more</u> <u>stairs</u> to get the elements to the Table nor for cleaning up!!

There are plans for a cosmetic fireplace, and larger doors into the NW storage room and the "choir door" to the sanctuary.

YOUR help will be NEEDED as we continue this project and get to the painting and finishing portion. Watch and listen for ways you can help.
