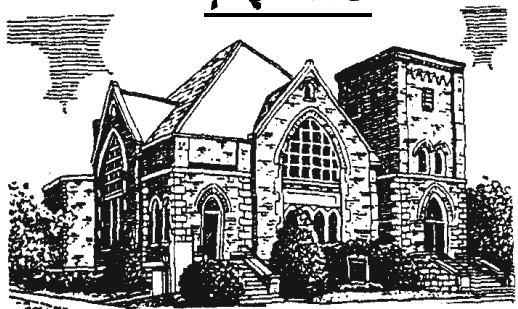

When I was young, and maybe a few pounds lighter, I could actually run pretty fast. It amazed some people how fast my short legs could move. So I thought of myself as a sprinter on the track team. I loved sprints, nothing longer than a 440. (That's yards, youngsters!)

Growing one's faith is not a sprint; it's a long-distance race.

(I suggest you look up in your Bible these passages, each using the image of "race" to describe what it takes to grow a relationship with God and with humans: I Corinthians 9:24; 2 Timothy 4:7; Hebrews 12:1.)

"Are a bride and groom ever more married than they are the first day? The vows are made and the certificate signed—could they be any more married than that? Imagine fifty years later. They finish each other's sentences, order each other's food. They even start looking alike— a thought which troubles Denalyn deeply. Wouldn't they be more married on their 50th anniversary than on their wedding day? Marriage is both a done deal and a daily development.

The same is true of our walk with God. Can you be more saved than you were the first day of your salvation? No. But can a person grow in salvation? Absolutely. Like marriage, it's a done deal and a daily development. Do you feel so saved, you never serve? The fact is, you and I are here for a reason, and that reason is to grow and glorify God in our service." (by Max Lucado)

The Church's history shows us time and again that periods of growth and commitment come in starts and spurts. It also shows that when it seems the Church is about to 'lose' to culture, then a time of growth and renewal is set to begin. It seems to me that in such times, when humans begin to wonder, "What next?" then the table is set for God to have more room to work; and work in miraculous and marvelous ways.

I wonder if Jesus isn't looking for the same sort of cowboy. He never offered a soft ride, but was a challenge to everyone who tried to stay with him. And if a person isn't looking for some high kicks, then they haven't figured out what sort of horse Jesus is!

Oh, about high school track? When I was growing up in Minnesota boys track and baseball were both spring sports. Many of the athletes would go out for both sports, but when it came time to practice, they headed to the baseball field. Well, in my class, there were only two of us who were track-only, so we ran; then ran some more. But in meets, I ran nothing longer than 440 yards.

UNTIL, On the way to a meet my sophomore season, the coach called from the front of the bus, "The 2-Mile Run has a weak field. If we run someone there, we should score points." The 2 Mile was a new event. We didn't have distance runners; we had baseball players who went to track meets! I offered to give up a leg in the 4 X 440 to run the 2 mile. It was that day I discovered what it meant to be a "runner." ALL sorts of thoughts can cross your mind as you go 'round eight times. I gutted it out. **THAT was running.** I ran it occasionally the next two years, "when we could score points." (The last I knew, I still held the [slow] school record for the 2-Mile Run when the school closed.)

There will be no nursery for Saturday evening. It will be wonderful to have full participation from the entire family.

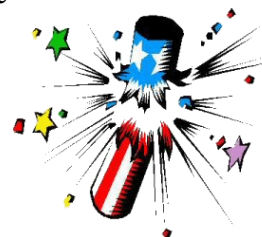

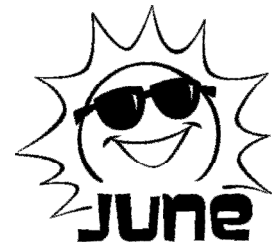
