Local Access Cable

On January 5th, 2015 the Tipton City Council approved a change in the format of the Local Access cable channel. This format change was brought about by the need to replace the aging equipment used to provide information and video to Mediacom. The council voted against replacing the equipment in favor of a much simpler format. Unfortunately, this

simpler format does not support video to be broadcast on the channel so FUMC will no longer be able to provide the Sunday service on TV. The Creative Worship work area is currently investigating other methods for making the recorded service available. Options include putting the service on DVD and distributing the disks, or online via the website, or a streaming service such as YouTube. Either option will require the purchase of additional equipment to make the distribution possible. If there isn't sufficient interest we may simply discontinue recording the service on a regular basis.

THE STORY continues! We're in the midst of listening in as the Northern Kingdom, "Israel," failed time and again to be faithful and fell to the Assyrians. Judah is next, as the Babylonians become the area's power and they take the effort and have the persistence to take down Jerusalem. Do you see the pattern? There is a constant tug-ofwar as powers ebb and flow in the region. One of my understandings of the 'power' and influence of King David was that he happened to be king when there was a vacuum of foreign influence from Egypt to the southwest and the Eastern influence. Timing is everything!

If you have not yet taken advantage of <u>THE STORY</u> resources and small groups (GIGs) I invite you to do so. <u>Your</u> Story is part of THE STORY.

## **Missions**

### **2014 Missions Report**

Thank you for so generously giving to Missions projects and making this church, by your prayers, participation and giving, a church that reaches well beyond these walls to bring glory to Jesus Christ and his love to many people. The Missions team anticipates that our church will be recognized as a 3<sup>rd</sup> mile Rainbow Covenant Church for the 8th year in a row! The Rainbow Covenant program helps churches develop an intentional approach to funding mission in the U.S. and globally. The copper kettle receipts or "noisy offering" taken during worship adds up as we collected \$2,993 in 2014.

Here is a summary of the projects supported in 2014: CWS Blankets - \$427.49; Cedar Rapids Matthew 25 Hub Ministry - \$101.42; UMCOR Sager Brown Depot - \$200; Ingathering - \$2,303.50; Women at the Well - \$125; Imagine No Malaria - \$200; Tree of Life - \$235; Easter Pool Offering (i.e. Human Relations, Rural Life) - \$1,964.40; One Great Hour of Sharing - \$650; Project CrossRoads/Mark Stransky - \$940; Project Crossroads - \$235; Mission of Hope - \$150; Builder's Call - \$230; Hispanic/Latino Ministries - \$125; Trinity UMC – Des Moines - \$125; Work Trip/Roof - \$3,811.13; Benevolence fund -\$2,178.45; 1st UMC Food Pantry - \$235; and Shared Blessings - \$4,800. The amounts listed include cash and in-kind donations.

Our total amount for missions giving (including apportionments) was \$52,235.41. In addition to these donations, many of you experienced being the "hands and feet of Jesus in the community and world" by helping neighbors and strangers. Thank you.

### **Project Crossroads Up-date**

Mark Stransky is the United Methodist missionary you financially support at Project Crossroads in Marion, Virginia. In 2014, we gave \$235 to Project Crossroads and \$940 to Mark Stransky. A group from our church did a work trip to Virginia in 2013 and assisted with the fire wood ministry described in the Project Crossroads winter 2015 newsletter. This is Mark's up-date on this ministry: "It was a cold November! Our wood ministry got off to a roaring start in early November as usual. By the time we began delivering firewood, our list had grown to 20 households. By mid-January, we will be out of dry, seasoned wood. This is about normal for our wood supply, but we could always use more. So far this winter, we have delivered approximately 80 pickup loads of firewood to 55 households. On a firewood delivery just before Christmas, an in-home nurse came out of a trailer and said "If you haven't met Kimberly, come on inside and let me show you who you're keeping warm." I'll never forget meeting Kimberly! She was a teenager paralyzed from the neck down and could not speak. But, her eves said it all, she melted my heart. Thank you for all your support! Evidenced above, the leadership of 1st UMC aims to do ministry as efficiently as possible. The fruitfulness is left to each and every one of us. All financial records are 'open.' Monthly spreadsheets of the General Budget are posted in the Gathering Place and a re-cap is in the newsletter; weekly offering receipts are included in the Sunday program.

Couple more items about this church's finances:

We attempt to be totally transparent with all financial accounts. If you have questions about some account, it's possible that: a) others may also be wondering; b) we might need to consider some additional reporting. Express your questions to the appropriate people so we know what information is needed!

We're trying to keep up with Internal Revenue Service expectations. SO, some of you who have been at worship in January and picked up your year-end statement of giving (thank you!) will be receiving or have already received another one that includes the required IRS disclaimer.

## 1ST UNITED METHODIST CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND

March is the one time/year the Leadership Council considers proposals for the use of income from the 1st UMC Endowment Fund. Please submit any proposals to the church office before March 11!! There are three designated categories from which funds may be requested:

- A. Missions/People projects: Local, District, Conference, National, international
- B. Maintenance/Trustees: major repairs, major improvements, special objects or furnishings
- C. Ministry/Program Development: Education, communication, evangelism, worship Guidelines state that income from Endowments may never go toward on-going, budgeted expenses of the church. Furthermore, the founding document states:

The existence of this Endowment Fund must in no way reduce the responsible current support and involvement of the church members.

Proposals may come from groups, committees or individuals, though it's preferred they come from a group or committee.

### **Backyard Boyz**

The Backyard Boyz is multi-day after-school program for boys in grades 6 through 8 living just north of downtown Des Moines in the vicinity of Trinity United Methodist Church. The ministry empowers young men to explore the possibilities for growth and change within them, among them, and around them (in their own "backyard").

During these coldest days of the year, for example, the Backyard Boyz are giving back to persons in the community who are living without the basics. For Martin Luther King Day, the middle school Boyz will serve homeless persons by packaging and distributing personal care packages, including such items as toothbrushes, toothpaste, mouthwash, floss, deodorant, Band-Aids, antibiotic ointment, lotion, combs, razors, shaving cream, water bottles, socks, hats, and gloves.

Young people who have aged out of the program and gone on to high school sometimes return as mentors. Not only does this encourage and inspire the next generation of Backyard Boyz. It also allows these older students to continue to work on their own self-development and leadership skills.

The Backyard Boyz represent only one component of a larger ministry, the <u>Children and Family Urban Movement</u>. CFUM's mission "is to create a community that supports the potential of children, youth, and families through educational success, healthy living, and community engagement."

Apportionment gifts from United Methodist churches all over Iowa have helped to support CFUM.

# HCI: Neighbors and Disciples Work Group Update

During the past few months, our Neighbors and Disciples work group (N&D) has been focused on the task of creating a "discipleship pathway" in order to meet one of the prescriptions of the HCI. We intend to take the informal formation of our GIGs and Sunday school classes and make something more formal, the intent of many of the prescriptions. Toward this end we have researched the pathways in place at other churches and looked at various types of materials and curricula. Our goal is to have a simple pathway that will guide our people from where they are spiritually to one step more mature, then one more after that and so on, mostly through the power of small groups, both GIGs and classes (and other groups too?), but also through individual prayer and study.

Why should we do this? The UMC believes that discipleship is vital for all Christians. From paragraph 135 of the <u>Book of Discipline 2012</u>, "The ministry of all Christians consists of privilege and obligation. The privilege is a relationship with God that is deeply spiritual. The obligation is to respond to God's call to holy living in the world. In the United Methodist tradition these two dimensions of Christian discipleship are wholly interdependent." (page 97, emphasis added). Being a disciple of Jesus means that you know him, know how he lived, and then you live like him. The knowing him part is the relationship and it truly is a privilege. The living like him is the obligation and the two cannot be separated.

For me the "why" of discipleship is obvious: all people have work to do in order to know more about Christ and become more Christ-like. Further, the great commission commands us to make disciples. Through our own church's new vision statement we see the faith journey of each of our people including "continual growth through small group and personal challenge". For many in the church, one place to start is to get to know and love Jesus. I read a statement recently (maybe in one of those books N&D was using for research...) someone had written to God: "I don't love you, I don't want to love you, but, I want to want to love you." Maybe we can relate, especially if we take a break from the busyness of life and take some time to reflect. If you can relate, and maybe even agree, the church has great resources and N&D is working to define and organize them. If you are not currently experiencing spiritual growth please prayerfully consider joining a GIG or class. If you're already in one, talk to your group for encouragement - that's what they're there for. There are also several ways to personally challenge yourself: pick up a copy of the Upper Room (or get it emailed daily), pick a book of the Bible to read, or read along with The Story each week. For other ideas, ask Pastor Paul, or me, or anyone of us in N&D. Additionally, if you have input for us as we work on this discipleship pathway, please let us know.
