Personal Reflection and Application:

As Christians, we are called to be different from the world and the culture we live in. If we aren't, how are we different from the world and culture of today, and how would non-Christians or believers see us and how we live, differently? There would be no difference.

Reflect this week on the people who shared the gospel of Jesus with you. What did they say? How did their lives reinforce the message of God's great love? Seek to use their examples as inspiration as you share the grace and good news of Jesus with those you encounter each day.
