Paul's Ponderings

I determined to pray Psalm 22 during the "Dark Saturday Prayer Vigil." I started out just fine as I prayed, "My God, My God." Sometimes it's a stretch to think that I can directly address God. For the Hebrews it was a death sentence to be that close to God or to even utter God's name but I got through that part okay.

But then I got to the last part of the first verse. Whoa. That slowed me down! I thought of some times, not nearly what Jesus experienced, when in a state of self-pity I might think, "Why have you forsaken me?" But eventually I dealt with that and was able to pray those words from a different vantage.

How many times have others prayed those words:

"My God, why have you left me alone?" (NCV) I realized that it may be their prayer because I am the one God expected to be with them, to bring illumination to the darkness of their loneliness, but I was too self-absorbed, distant or pre-occupied to think of another; and to be with them as a servant, a minister on God's behalf. After all, Jesus on the cross reminds us that in God's way of dealing with the world, God thinks incarnation is pretty important.

Okay, so it was an experiment. Isn't worship always an experiment? How can humans even pretend how to adequately express the glory of God? But sometimes words can be inadequate and fall short of the goal. So, yes, it was with some amount of consternation, and after sharing the link with various people whom I respect and asking for their feedback, that I determined to use a 20 minute 'video story-sermon' for the 7:00 a.m. Easter service. While I am eager for feedback on the use of such media in such a setting, the tears people were subtly wiping from their eyes suggested to me that any words I could have put

Then I thought of something I recently read: "A prophet is someone who knows what time it is." I frequently think of myself as a prophet, but do I know, always, 'what time it is?'

Putting it another way, where today is the road from Selma to Montgomery? How many people today died in the Arizona desert between water holes or shade trees? How many people, even people I know, needed to be reminded today that their life matters?

Well, after a while my body needed to move and I looked at the clock. It had been an hour and a half, but I was already on verse 10. I decided it was a good place to quit:

*On you I was cast from my birth,
And since my mother bore me
You have been my God.*

Those words to me were the fresh breath of prevenient grace, that even if I am not as prophetic, not as faithful, not as passionate as I might be, I am God's and there's nothing that can change that.

I'll have to pray the remaining 21 verses some other time.

together would quite likely fallen short of such impact.

I wished we had more time and occasion to process the film, as that is exactly what the confirmation class was able to do later in the morning. Every person, every person's personal experience brings nuance and breadth to the meaning and validity of the message of "The Butterfly Circus." If you missed the 7:00 a.m. Easter service, just google "The Butterfly Circus." You'll also notice that there are discussion questions available.

Our work with THE STORY is now nearly completed. Or, is it more appropriate, and I pray, accurate, to say it is now ready to begin?! There is much more to "THE STORY," not only the aspect of catching up on all the parts of the Bible not covered in the abridged text, but also... How shall we live THE STORY in our world?

Thank you for the work you've put into it. I appreciate that the children's Sunday School teachers put some plans on hold or adapted to include the themes that their siblings and parents and others in the church would also be studying. By the way, the financing of THE STORY was an act of faith. We "charged" nothing for the materials and made them as available as we could. Yet, as people were moved, we received material donations in the amount of \$1,611. Our cost wasn't much more than \$2,000. Thank you. *Pastor Paul*

Thank you to the 28 people, from preschool through senior adults, who signed in at the prayer vigil on Holy Saturday, April 4. Participants were not asked directly for feedback, but we heard that it was a blessing for those who were new to a prayer vigil and to those who have been to many. With some interactive features, like carrying a cross, singing a hymn, acting out stories; as well as quiet reading, reflecting, and prayer, it was designed to allow for everyone to have some time with talking God and listening. We posed a few finish the sentence statements and then turned the responses into these word clouds. The larger the words are in the word cloud, the more often the word occurred in the response. For example, in the "Prayer is..." cloud the most frequently written word was God, followed by conversation, talk, asking, and forgiveness. Our next prayer vigil will be around November.

HOSPITALIZED?

Healing is a big part of the Christian tradition. It is important for healing that the mind and spirit cooperate with the body. It is precisely for that reason that in the old days, most hospitals made a phone contact with a patient's local church/pastor upon admission. Please be aware that hospitals no longer make that contact with your local church. (There is one in the area that has a chaplain's department willing to make that call but it may not happen in a timely manner – depending on other responsibilities that beg the chaplain's attention.) Your pastor is willing to make hospital visits; and we have some lay people willing to be health ministers, but you will not see either one if we do not know you are there.

Also, in the realm of "caring ministry," we do not provide care on the basis of "I read it on Facebook." That's just too closely related to gossip! If you read something on Facebook, check it out and then if caring ministry is needed and welcome, contact the church office.

Sometimes people are hesitant to provide notification because they don't want to inconvenience or put the pastor or parish visitor 'out.' Well, for that very reason, every (UM) church is required to have a line in their budget for "Mileage." When we travel for ministry-related purpose, we turn in mileage. In 2014 that amounted to a reimbursement of \$2,437.40.

Little Friends Preschool (LFP) Update

The 'transition board' of Kim Walter, Gail Fleming, Diane Wallick, Bob Young and Pastor Paul with clerical assistance from Kim Cross continues to work on documents, policies, procedures in preparation for licensing LFP under the ownership of First UMC. One of our actions was to identify a mission statement:

The Bible tells us, "Jesus grew and became strong; he was filled with wisdom, and the grace of God was upon him." (Luke 2:40)

Little Friends Preschool will provide a setting for learning, creativity and fun that encourages growth of the whole child. We celebrate and give importance to both the academic and social development of children. Most importantly, your child is God's 'Little Friend!' We want your child to grow and know how special they are. We will strive to give families a sense of community, raising children together.

We are also working on a new logo, trying to build off the 49 year tradition of Little Friends as it slightly changes direction to be a church owned and operated "ministry." Mary Jo Heil is helping us with a logo that communicates the message that all children are "God's Little Friends!" (No, the bearded guy in a robe is not Pastor Paul!)

There are all sorts of forms which must be prepared and ready prior to putting out the formal enrollment packet to parents. Our target is mid-way through the month of May. Names for prospective students are being accepted. YOU can pass the word!
