Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors

Amy Dickinson has heard it all. In her syndicated advice column that appears across the U.S., "Ask Amy," she throws in her two cents about everything from cheating spouses and bad etiquette to nasty neighbors and embarrassing family members.

The common sense expert also gets her fair share of emails from church members fed-up with the behavior of certain pew 'neighbors.' Don't we all know one or two of those *annoying* members—the mother who changes her baby's diaper in the back pew or the old-timer who takes a nap during the sermon... and then snores until the organist hits the first note of "Just As I Am, Without One Plea"?

Which is worse...the annoying or the annoyed? Amy, a very active member of Freeville UMC in Freeville, New York, may draw the line at texting during sermons and singing barefoot in the choir—but those misbehaviors are on a very short list of manners bad enough to make her eyes roll. For the most part she comes from a long line of Sunday school teachers who imparted that Amy and her classmates treat ALL people with love—even the ones who smack their chewing gum during prayers.

"Often it's not the people accused of misbehaving that need to learn a lesson," Amy said. "Maybe it's not the annoying, but the annoyed who need to lighten up. Maybe the question they need to ask themselves is 'What is this person here to teach me?"" Think differently. Think what Jesus would do about late arrivers and interrupted sermons.

Well, what would Jesus do? "Allow the children to come to me, don't forbid them, because the kingdom of heaven belongs to people like these children." (Matthew 19:14)

Church is not a Norman Rockwell painting! Some personality clashes, misperceptions or "unchristian-like" behavior issues are clergy matters. The pastor may need to do some coaching if a member is continually disruptive or divisive.

But when it's just feathers ruffling, Amy believes annoyances can be used as teachable moments. "For me, it's about extracting humility, exercising kindness and stretching myself," she said. "Those of us who are strong enough to tolerate certain annoyances should. I try to catch people using their gifts— There have been times I've kept a distance between myself and others, but later I ended up feeling glad I was exposed to them. Yes, it was disruptive, but it **softened my heart.**"

"Isn't getting uncomfortable what we're called to do? If we are not in church to sit beside the unwashed [and the ill-mannered] then why are we there?"

Discomfort is good for the soul. "Focus on the big picture," said Daniel Parsely, who serves as the Worship Arts Coordinator and Director of Chancel Music at Faith UMC. "We're all here for the same purpose to be welcoming, understanding, open, loving, and forgiving people...

It's not about standing at the correct time, not hearing enough of your favorite hymns, or giving a thumbs up or down to videos being shown during worship. It's about putting less importance on you and on your personal preferences. It's about doing what's best for the community of worshippers—the body of Christ." (Article from UM Communications; April 6, 2015)

When speaking with Nathen and Kim Anderson prior to Jorden's baptism, I asked what a parent might expect of a church that affirms *"With God's help I will so order my life after the example of Christ that [these children], surrounded by steadfast love, may be established in the faith, and confirmed and strengthened in the way that leads to life eternal."* (Hymnal p. 44)

Our conversation included ideas as: support, role modeling, non-judgment, community, acceptance, guidance, family, resources and the church being a place and people where it's okay to be vulnerable and mistakes are permissible.

As I spent time considering the Apostle Paul's ventures nurturing the early church, didn't he encourage people to focus on such matters?

After School JAMS, Van Horne

It's not a collection of fruit preserves or a series of traffic snarls that attracts kids to church. It's all about the music.

After School JAMS (Jesus And Music Service) is a ministry of Salem United Methodist Church in Van Horne. Children from the elementary school next door come to the church on Wednesdays after school for singing and dancing to hymns and popular Christian music.

The idea came from a discussion during a prayer group meeting, when some women were expressing concern that kids didn't know Christmas carols. JAMS was born to teach the hymns to the children. They eat a snack when they first arrive at the church followed by some music time.

In recent years, they have added time for service projects. The children have tied fleece blankets for persons who are ill and made cookies for persons who are shut in during the winter months, among other examples. Stacie Gorkow explained that they "want to show kids that Jesus loves each one of them and that they need to share that love with others."

A grant from the East Central District, which is made possible with apportionment gifts from United Methodist churches, like Tipton First UMC, has helped to support the After School JAMS.

Discipleship

Tri-County Community Band, with musicians from Muscatine, Scott and Cedar Counties, is coming to Tipton July 2nd and will be playing an evening concert, 7:30 p.m., on the Courthouse lawn. This year's concert is the kick-off event for the weekend celebration of Tipton's 175th birthday!!!

We will add one element to this hospitality this year. We will have a box set out for "Prayer Concerns & Celebrations." It may be wise to have a person or two who hang around that box during intermission. Is that YOU?

Update: Little Friends Preschool

The Transition Board of Kim Walter, Diane Wallick, Bob Young, Pastor Paul with input from Gail Fleming has been b-u-s-y!! We've needed to create documentation for the licensing process. That includes two job descriptions, emergency plans, parent forms for medical emergencies, authorization for pickups, health checks, and photo forms. We're also spending time trying to 'balance the books,' which is trying to anticipate enrollments (income) and expenses.

The State gives themselves 120 days to determine if a site receives a license, so our 'feet are to the fire' to get the remainder of the documentation, procedures and policies in place so we can have our license interview at or around June 1.

Another aspect of the church taking on Little Friends as a ministry is that we borrowed \$4,000 (from ourselves) to pay for it. We're inviting people who have a passion for the welfare of children to, as you feel led and are able, to donate toward that initial cost of purchase. So far, we CELEBRATE that we've received \$2,570 toward that cost of purchase. That also means we have \$1,425 yet to go. The Transition Board is not dealing with this side of the ministry. If you want to put some effort toward keeping the church informed, writing grants or making other solicitations, talk to Pastor Paul.
