SUNDAY CALLER TRAINING

Did you know that lay persons may have more influence than the pastor? At least in one area of invitation and hospitality, it is proven to be true! When a visitor to worship is graced with a "Thank you for worshipping with us" visit to their home within 36 hours after worship, if that 'door-knock' is by a lay person it is more than twice as likely they will return than if that visit is by the pastor!

Therefore, we are officially beginning the ministry of "SUNDAY CALLERS." The process is simple:

After worship we will check to see if there are any first-time, area resident worshippers.

If so, we will fill out a card with all available information.

The scheduled "Sunday Caller" will take the card and make a visit to the residence by sundown Monday. (It's even okay if you beat them home from worship!!)

The visit is brief. It is not interrogation. "Thank you; we hope you come again."

The Sunday Caller returns the card to the church office when convenient but at least by the next Sunday.

I'll be meeting with anyone interested, curious or committed to be a Sunday Caller Wednesday, July 8th at 6:30 p.m. Let me know if you're interested and if you can't make that meeting we'll meet one-on-one. My goal is to have at least four and up to eight Sunday Callers so persons are scheduled no more than once a month.

Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors



“Loving Jesus Christ is the mission of the church; everything else is just strategy.”

I am not sure who made this comment at Annual Conference, but it was one of the speakers/preachers. It's a line that I need to remember because sometimes the “strategy” can consume the day and I may not have used fully or most effectively the hours, moments, events and opportunities to “love Jesus Christ” and to help others do the same.

I do remember the speaker then referred to the Sermon on the Mount as a treatise of Jesus encouraging all those spiritually hungry, seeking, religious people to change the focus of their lives. Reading Matthew 5, 6 & 7 using that lens really puts context on Matthew 6:33: *“But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well.”*

We have no shortage of enterprises, activities, events, people and even relationships to draw us away from that central call of the gospel toward the lures of idolatry. And it's no easier for any one person than another to keep the focus on God's Kingdom. It's good for us, individually, to pray honestly and openly:

*Bountiful God who held nothing back from showing your love to humanity,
reveal to us that which lures us from singleness of purpose and focus.
Give me Jesus, new, every day. Amen.*

One of the presenters at Annual Conference was Adam Hamilton, lead and founding pastor of Church of the Resurrection. He shared that his church started out, in 1990, with four people: himself, his wife, their two daughters. After a time of relational outreach, they met in a funeral home chapel, and that's when they took the name, Church of the Resurrection; aka COR. When they outgrew the funeral home, they needed another location. They identified two choices, an elementary school gymnasium that would need to be set up every week early Sunday morning and emptied by 1:00 p.m.; or a church building and grounds of an established church that was moving to another location.

He said the Trustees toured both; balanced the pros and cons; and decided to go with the church building. BUT,

after a sleepless night, Pastor Hamilton contacted the Trustees and said, “I think we've made a mistake.” They listened to his thoughts and changed direction. Now with a membership of around 20,000 and a reputation for intentional, focused, transforming ministries, worship and leadership, Pastor Hamilton wondered aloud the other day what would have happened if they had done what seemed **most logical**, definitely **most easy** and certainly **most ‘churchy.’** He suggested COR would now have an impact similar to the church they would have replaced.

Keeping the focus on Jesus has a way of making us do crazy things for a God who is always working to make all things new.

Sometimes, when you are living in a rough situation or going through a rough time, you need a good story to take you away, to give you power, to help you dream about changing your own story.

The Iowa Conference hopes to help thousands of children do just that through a reading initiative called Change a Child's Story. The Conference has set a goal to get 500,000 books into the hands of at-risk children in the state of Iowa. Yes, that's pretty ambitious! There will be an effort made to work with stakeholders, some of whom are way out ahead of us on this effort.



Last year I went to a continuing education event at Pella. Dr. Peter Steinke talked about the importance of total brain development; that 250,000 neurons a DAY are being developed ages 1 to 3 !! I've read that by age 4 children in affluent households hear around 45 million words while children in poverty hear 13 million words. Every word creates a neuron or more.

School Teachers: How can we help the children/families/classrooms? Put us to work! It's one way we can live into the vows we speak with every baptism!!

SAFE SANCTUARY UPDATE

Jenn Johnson has agreed to assume the responsibilities of being the administrator for our church of the Safe Sanctuary procedures and processing of information. For your review or information, here's the mission statement and purpose of the Protection Policy:

First United Methodist Church Child, Youth and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy

Mission Statement

As members of First United Methodist Church (FUMC), we believe, in accordance with our Christian principles, that it is in the best interest of the church and the children, youth and vulnerable adults of the church to adopt policies, procedures, screening tools and training to better protect the physical, mental and emotional well-being of the children, youth and vulnerable adults who participate in FUMC church-sponsored activities.

Purpose of Policy

The purpose for determining and implementing policies and procedures for staff and volunteers who work with children, youth and vulnerable adults in the church is to protect the children, youth and vulnerable adults from abuse; and to protect the staff and volunteers from being unfairly accused of abusing any child, children, youth or vulnerable adults in any manner.

We will be scheduling at least one session of the basic (required) class to take place in August. This class is a basic requirement prior to adults or teens working with younger populations. As pastor I must apologize that we've been remiss the past couple years and have not required persons to comply with Safe Sanctuary directives. I am quite sure Jenn will head us in a more healthy direction!
