

Mediocre Grace

"Dietrich Bonhoeffer's classic 1937 book, The Cost of Discipleship, describes cheap grace as the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline and communion without confession. It's the sort of grace that allowed would-be disciples to avoid confronting the evils of Nazi Germany. These days, cheap grace has competition. In an effort to appease a different kind of cultural complacency, grace has come to mean a bar that is set quite low. Offering this grace requires little to no accountability, enforces few if any standards, and bears almost no fruit. In churches, this low-level grace is most apparent in our communal and organizational life. It translates into a kind of laissez faire, you're off the hook, no accountability stance.

This isn't cheap grace. It's worse than that. It's mediocre grace.

But mediocrity is not a biblical value. Jesus killed trees that bore no fruit. He spit out the lukewarm. He counseled followers to let their yes be yes and their no be no.

When it comes to perpetuating a culture of mediocrity in churches, there's plenty of blame to go around—from the system, to pastors, to lay people, to denominationalism itself. Not to mention the larger culture that is rapidly changing, and lives that are overly busy. The list is long..."

Rebekah Simon-Peter hits us hard, doesn't she? There's a reference in the writing of Revelation 3:16 that God vomits the "luke-warm" out of God's mouth. That's pretty harsh! Ouch! Yet, as she writes about mediocre grace I can't help but think about our own situation, when we claim 470 "members" but have just over 100 worshipping on an average Sunday. We are hesitant to tell others about our faith or even to invite them to pray with or for us. Ministries can struggle for viability as schedules and/or priorities don't allow for servanthood. But Simon-Peter closes her blog with this comment:

It takes practice to move from mediocre to miraculous, from resignation to rejoicing. But church cultures *can* and *do* shift—a bit at a time. The good news and the bad news about this is the same: it all starts with us.

Now <u>that's</u> exciting! You and I have the ability to frame the future of not only this church, but to offer hope and inspiration to people right now, right here. God has always worked through friends and neighbors and has not changed that protocol.

We have experienced huge transitions at 1st UMC. Ken McKay was a member of the "Long-Term Facilities Task Force." A couple Sundays ago we were talking about January 2007 when the Task Force presented their huge, extensive report. That entire list – and more – is done! That's a tangible example of going from "resignation" ("We can't do it.") to "rejoicing"; "mediocre to miraculous." But God's not done! That's just a tease! In fact, in 2007 we were only dreaming of having small groups for spiritual growth. We are now over 50 people in GIGs and growing.

We don't want anyone to miss the opportunities. One of the responsibilities laid on your pastor and the Leadership Council is to encourage people to active participation in their church as one means of growing in grace. This is outlined in The Book of Discipline 2012, paragraph 228 (page 159ff). The Leadership Council has recently been presented with the names of people who have been or become inactive. Their task is to pray for them; make a contact; ask if there is anything we might do/offer to help them reactivate; to encourage regular participation with a church, this one or another.

Perhaps we can, with the Apostle Paul, assist people to do this one thing:

"forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 3:13b & 14)





[pf] As I read Vicki's note I was reminded of what the apostle Paul had to say in 1 Corinthians 3:6:

Each of us is, every day, given opportunity to assist someone on their journey. Can you think of someone you assisted this past week? How will you "plant" or "water" this coming week?

It was announced at the 10:30 Easter service that **Melinda Stonebraker** feels a strong call to pastoral ministry. She has applied to and been accepted at the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary, to begin this Fall. In the United Methodist Church one's call to ministry is first considered not by a group of professors nor even pastors, but by peers who have lived, learned and grown with a person. Your Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) is given the responsibility to interview persons who have had a "call". It is then their responsibility to assess evidence of gifts and fruits. They can affirm the call, based on their experience; or they might say "not yet" or they could even suggest that the person has not, in fact and practice, shown potential for leadership in ministry.

At a meeting held March 22, your SPRC affirmed Melinda's gifts and had no shortage of evidence of the fruits of her spirit, leadership and passion. She is now proceeding with further steps to pursue the status of "Certified Candidate" for ministry.

You are invited to support not only Melinda but Ryan, Zoe and Lea as they all continue this exciting—and scary—journey.

LEAVING A LEGACY

There was an article titled "Whom Should You Ask?" An Amish man was once asked by an eager young evangelist whether he had been saved; and whether he had accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior.

The Amish gentleman replied, "Why do you ask me such a thing? I could tell you anything. Here are the names of my banker, my grocer, and my farm hands. Ask them if I've been saved."

There is a sense that one cannot testify of one's self. If a person says, "I am the greatest," it means nothing until results testify to the fact. [If you have some years, you might recall the 'empty boasting' of Mohammed Ali that "I am the greatest" ... until he beat Quarry, Foreman & Frazier, winning the world title three times! Or how 'bout Joe Namath's mouth the two weeks prior to Super Bowl III; eventually proving prophetic as the Jets beat the Colts 16-7!] In a sense, someone claiming, "I am a Christian," is invalid until there is someone or something else that confirms that testimony.

Well, with the LEAVING A LEGACY campaign, we have an opportunity to be a witness to those who have made an impact on our lives. Sure, you can also give money without the attribution, but it is intended to force each of us to consider those who have gone before and those who will follow after.
