Paul's Ponderings

The Boston marathon is just two days away as I write this. I have an article in front of me, "2 Things We Need to Become Spiritually Fit" from the website Ministry Matters. It is unlikely that I'll ever discover these two truths by actually running a marathon, so I've decided to read the article. The author claims we can learn about being spiritually fit by what it takes to be marathon fit:

1. As runners advance they take advantage of water stations along the route. Even before they "feel like it," runners take in water. (I would say once they feel like they "need" water it may be too late?! pf)

In the same way, if we are to "run the race set before us" we need to hydrate occasionally along the route.

At home devotions/Bible Study, intentional daily prayer, Christian conversation, these are all important for the race. It's a long one!

2. But it's more than water; distance runners need sustained nutrition. It's a package of food, exercise, sleep, training regimen, etc.

Applying this to spiritual formation, this part of our preparation includes personal & social holiness, use of spiritual disciplines, and food, exercise and sleep/Sabbath just as a "runner" does! And most runners will point to the importance of supportive community to encourage or, if necessary or requested, to run


CLEAN UP SCHEDULE



Discipleship Pathway

Small Group Community

Small groups for discipleship are not new; they've been around for many centuries. And yet, our need for a group as a catalyst for spiritual growth has not changed. Read the portion of an article from umc.org reprinted below. It describes the purpose of small groups at the start of the Methodist movement. Does it sound like something you need? Does it sound like something you're already in? At 1st UMC-Tipton, groups are mostly known as GIGs, short for Growth and Impact Groups. If you're not in one yet, contact the church office to find one. If you are in one, consider how much your group looks like groups started by John Wesley. If your group needs to be tweaked, talk it over with your members and make some changes. May God bless us as we seek to be Deeply Rooted, Branching Out, and Bearing Fruit.

John Wesley (1703-1791), founder of the Methodist movement, succinctly described the plan of discipleship in what he called The General Rules. As Christians, we are to (1) do no harm by avoiding evil of every kind; (2) do good to all people; and (3) attend upon all the ordinances of God like participating in worship, taking Communion, reading the Bible, praying, and more.

Unfortunately, knowing that does not always translate into living it.

The Apostle Paul understood the struggle. In Romans 7:15 he wrote, "I don't know what I'm doing, because I don't do what I want to do. Instead, I do the thing that I hate" (CEB). I get that! So did John Wesley.

While trying to pay off a mortgage incurred when the Methodist movement purchased a building where they would hold Society meetings, Wesley and the other leaders came up with an ingenious plan. They

divided the Society into "classes" of about 12 people each where one was designated the leader. The leader's job was to meet with each member weekly to collect a penny.

Wesley would later describe what the leaders learned during their visits. One member was "quarreling with his wife. Another was found in drink." Clearly, the early Methodists knew the General Rules, but were struggling to follow them.

"It immediately struck into Mr. Wesley's mind," Wesley wrote about himself, "This is the very thing we wanted. The *leaders* are the persons who may not only receive the contributions, but also watch over the souls of their brethren" (Wesley "Thoughts upon Methodism").

Soon, the Classes started meeting together to "watch over one another in love, that they may help each other to work out their salvation".

The weekly Class Meetings had a singular purpose. Each person was asked to answer this question, "How does your soul prosper?" Today, we might say, "How is your spiritual life?"

As people's lives were changed, the Class Meeting ministry model began to spread across England, and later across what would become the United States.



During the Leaving a Legacy Financial Campaign, we've used the song "Find Us Faithful" by Jon Mohr, made popular by Steve Green. Read the text of the song below and consider the footprints of the legacy you are leaving.

Neighbors & Disciples

When Pastor Paul and Jane are on vacation on-call pastors will be available to provide services if and as needed. Outside of office hours, you may contact one of the Lay Leaders, Kathy Houstman (886-6239) or Ron Salmonson (886-2315) and they will determine with you the best way to address the situation.



One of the projects the Trustees hope to accomplish with Leaving A Legacy funds is replacement of the breezeway doors. Current doors are too heavy and dangerous for many preschool children. They're also not handicapped-accessible.

1st UMC Endowment

We have received the dividend income from the 1st UMC Endowment for the past year. It amounts to a total of \$744.48 to be divided this way:

\$223.34 or 30% to go toward Mission projects

\$223.34 or 30% to go toward Maintenance (trustee) projects

\$297.80 or 40% to go toward Ministries

These funds are used via an application method annually at the March meeting of the Leadership Council. We have utilized these funds for many emerging ministries, from Financial Peace University to Shared Blessings to bus funds. These funds allowed installation of the video monitor in the sanctuary and this year the Leadership Council approved a program for parents called "Right Click," giving helpful ways to parent in the midst of all the technology that we have around us. These funds are not to be used toward items already on the General Budget of the church. Every year in March groups can apply to the Leadership Council for use of these funds.

LEAVING A LEGACY CAMPAIGN has the goal of \$100,000. It's nearly ½ of that right now! We started with \$31,227 from the Edie Ford bequest. Since the campaign entered the "receipts" stage, you've given \$13,360 so there's a total of \$44,587. We also have pledged funds in the amount of \$13,500. Any amount of money and any amount of prayer (!) is appreciated for this effort to keep the programs, fixtures and facilities even more "kidfriendly", safe and serviceable for God's glory.

The concept was 'conversational' for years until Carol Maxwell asked that the Richard Lehmeier memorial funds be designated for a fireplace. That set some wheels actually turning. When Gail Fleming heard of the concept, she gave some memorial funds in memory of her mother, Alice Anderson. Then Jerry, Connie and Chris said that would be a very fitting memorial to their mom and dad, Max and Judy Keller.

Cheryl Person and Jane Moen did the work of design and coordination with Kofron Builders and Michael Thomas of Thomas Heating & Air. Years ago Brian Heil had strung some cables so "some day we can hook up the TV that will be over the fireplace." He did all the electronic finagling for the installation and purchase of equipment. That equipment was purchased from the Edie Ford/Leaving A Legacy funds, the 15% portion that is being used at the discretion of the Leadership Council. It was fun seeing the excitement in the children last Sunday!! NOT so exciting to know that a number of them are now thinking they can 'go to worship' in the Gathering Place, and sit in comfy chairs...

While there is the possibility of nicer bookshelves being made and installed, the fireplace is really the capstone of a 9-year dream of taking a room that was mostly useless and making it one of purpose, comfort, welcome and ministry. Once again I must note the great work done in 2006 by the Long-Term Facilities Task Force. This group composed of Glenn Eaton, Brad Kirkpatrick, Ken McKay and Barb Rickard did a marvelous job of taking the bird's-eye view, thinking outside the box, conceiving the possibilities, giving us a map for the way forward. Not only has this been a tremendous work of God, I believe we have been faithful to put this church in position to be an important participant in God's work in this community.


