#### Work Trip 2016



#### Breakfast Fundraiser for Liberia

Trinity Lutheran church invites you to breakfast being served 8:45-9:30 am, Sunday, August 14<sup>th</sup> at 120 W 7<sup>th</sup> Street in Tipton. The tickets cost \$7 and a family of four can eat for the cost of three. The funds raised will go to Trinity Lutheran Church in Cedar Rapids to pay for a cargo shipment of clothes, shoes, soccer balls, school supplies, medi-

cal supplies such as gauze and Tylenol, blankets, dry food, etc. to Bong County, Liberia.

Villagers received the goods this summer. The inspection/shipment cost \$7000 instead of the predicted \$4000. 100% of funds raised will go to shipping. Mike Herring will be at Tipton UMC for fellowship coffee following worship July 31<sup>st</sup> and August 7<sup>th</sup> if you'd like to buy tickets at that time. ## Discipleship Pathway: Invitational Evangelism

Always be ready to give an answer when someone asks you about your hope. 1 Peter 3:15, CEB

The word evangelism makes many of us get sweaty palms. We think about knocking on doors or stopping someone on the street to ask where they want to spend eternity. We need to expand our vision of what evangelism looks like. It means to share good news. It can be as simple as inviting someone to church or having a conversation about faith. You only need to look around a bit to see that our world needs some good news! So why do we hesitate to share, and how can we better prepare to answer?

One reason could be that we haven't explored our own answers to faith questions. In our Discipleship Pathway Self-Assessment, we give an example of beginning stage invitational evangelism as "I admire others who can talk about their faith and am exploring questions in my own faith." That is a good beginning point. If you don't understand what the good news means for you well enough to share it, then explore your questions. A GIG (Growth & Impact Group) is a great place to do this, so start asking questions in your GIG or if you're not in one, join an existing group or start a new one! Melinda Stonebraker can help you get in a group.

Another reason we don't invite people or don't share our faith is we don't think we know anyone who doesn't already know Christ. If you've been in the church for a long time, it's possible that many of your friends are also in church. Further along in our Discipleship Pathway Self-Assessment is another example of invitational evangelism "I am actively trying to relate more to people outside of the church in ways that reflect God's love and acceptance of them. I share my faith." We need to be intentional about relating to people so we can share God's love. Go outside, learn who your neighbors are, find someone at work or around town, and share God's love with them.

Maybe the underlying reason we don't share our faith with others is we take Jesus for granted. We get too busy. We don't pay attention to how much Christ has shaped our lives. Or, we don't give much thought to allowing our lives to be molded in the first place. Maybe you've heard the instruction to "Preach the Gospel; Use Words if Necessary". Yes, certainly the way we live should communicate our faith and hope in the gospel of Jesus Christ. Without action words are just hot air. Remember too, that words *are* necessary. We have been give hope; it's good news! Are you prepared to share your hope? If not, take a step toward being prepared—you're probably a lot closer than you think.
