Between Sundays ~ Thoughts from Pastor Jenny

We are called as followers of Jesus Christ to seek to be more like Jesus Christ in our daily lives of work, family, and play. That happens when we take intentional steps to grow our faith. That's what the commitment is about when we officially join this congregation of Tipton United Methodist Church. There are five things that a person commits to do in the joining of the church (either officially or unofficially) and that is, "uphold the church by their prayers, their presence, their gifts, their service, and their witness." It is found in the membership vows and in the baptismal covenant. But what does it mean to live out our vows thru prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness?

Prayers: Seeking ways to be <u>Deeply Rooted</u> in Christ happens when we talk often with God thru prayer, scripture reading and reflection. *Increase the time you talk with God each day. The Apostle Paul urges prayer* "without ceasing." (1 Thessalonians 5:17)

Presence: A commitment to presence means we pay attention to the time and to the place we are at in the present moment, looking and listening for God's guidance. When we promise "presence" to the congregation, we commit to be engaged to the place and people who compose both the congregation and the community the congregation serves. This helps us to be people who are <u>Branching Out</u> for God thru worship and small group GIGs.

Gifts: This commitment encourages us to be <u>Bearing Fruit</u> by using our spiritual gifts, our natural abilities, our material assets, our training and experience to uphold God's church. We have opportunities each day to discover and develop gifts, then a responsibility through this vow to full stewardship of our time, abilities, and finances. To paraphrase John Wesley, "Gain all you can. Save all you can. Give all you can." To live by these tenants is to live fully into your calling to follow Christ.

Service: The commitment to service reminds us that Jesus' life was an example of living as a servant and his words instructed his disciples to do the same. Participate in church services and mission projects. When you recognize an unmet need, work with others to try to meet the need.

Volunteer regularly to serve the church and community through the various opportunities before you. This is another way that we can be Bearing Fruit for Christ.

Witness: A promise to witness reminds us that other people see and hear us all the time. Our living, our words, our actions and commitments are a witness to our priorities. Upholding God's church with our witness is a vow to let our life speak. Live with integrity so that your words and actions honor God, honor yourself, and honor others. Greet and speak warmly to others, especially visitors in your church, co-workers, and people with whom you live, do business and interact every day.

It is a blessings to serve as your pastor, and I am experiencing great peace about it. Even amid the peace, there is much work to be done to live into our calling to follow Christ. Honoring the membership commitment to your fullest ability helps to build a strong community of believers who are disciples of Jesus Christ. **On November 13** during our worship service we will have the opportunity to once again (or for the first time) commit to ministries of this, Christ's church here in Tipton. I hope you will prayerfully consider how God is calling YOU to commit to the church through your prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness.

Mission Trip

Tipton First UMC is pulling together a group of youth and adults to go to Baton Rouge to do rebuilding from the 2016 flooding. As of late October, they are still mucking out the mud and crud from the flooding and will begin the rebuilding process in December. Our group will be timed right to continue rebuilding in March. Ed, the Coordinator, said that there were more square miles of damage from the 2016 floods there than from Hurricane Katrina, but this storm didn't have a name. 150,000 homes were damaged.

Here are the basics:

Dates: Leave Tipton on Sat. March 11, stay the night near Jackson, MS. Arrive Baton Rouge, Sun. March 12. (approx. 14 hour trip)

Work days: March 13-17

Leave after working on March 17 and drive 5 hours?? Or leave the morning of the 18th.

Arrive home March 18 (or 19 if we leave on the morning of the 18th)

There is a full kitchen and showers in the 4 hosting churches in Baton Rouge so could do breakfast and packed lunches each day and eat out for supper. (Or cook supper a few nights)

Cost:

7 or 8 nights at \$15 per person per night (fixed rate while sleeping in a church) = \$105 or \$120

Work fee charge per person for the week = \$100 (fixed rate)

Gas per person \$65 approx. Payment Schedule: Food = \$150 per person, approx. Deposit of \$25 Nov. 20, 2016

Payment 2 of \$110 Dec. 18, 2016 Payment 3 of \$150 Jan. 22, 2017

Payment 4 Balance Feb. 19, 2017

(Scholarship money available-See Pastor Jenny)

There will be fundraising opportunities to offset the cost.

In order to secure a spot, please get a form from the church office, complete it and return it to the church office by November 20, 2016 with a \$25 deposit. Please note that the deposit is non-refundable, but it is transferrable. Once the numbers are known, there will be a deposit paid to the Louisiana Relief effort to secure the spot for the week in March and relay the numbers.

Thanksgiving Offering

Total est. cost = \$435 per person

The Thanksgiving offering will be split equally between the church's benevolence fund and local Iowa needs. The Benevolence Fund is used to assist people in Cedar County with anything from utilities to food assistance to transportation costs. Local Iowa needs ensures your generosity blesses as many people as possible in sustainable, strategic ways.


"Prayer is Where the Action Is" -John Wesley





Results of Snack and Stories

Thank you to all who attended the Snacks and Stories and to the folks who hosted the gatherings. It was a very fruitful time of learning about you all and for you to learn about one another. I am still planning to do up to three more, but wanted to share with you some of the insights from the gatherings before too much time passed. I asked the same five questions of each of the twelve groups, consisting of 5 to 15 people. Here is the rundown of trends I noticed.

When asked why are you a part of this church, here were the answers that dominated: Many grew up in the church or married someone from the church. Others joined because they had grown up Methodist and this is the church in town. I was glad to hear that some were there because of personal invitation or because of the openness of the people in the church. Ironically many said it was a welcoming church, while an equal number said it was cliquey and hard to get to know people.

Folks had the chance to share what bugs them about the church, and many responses were surprising. Did you know that when the renovation happened, there were folks that wanted to put in a shower for mission groups to use when they stay? It bugs many people that it did not happen. Some people think the sanctuary is too cluttered and inaccessible. It is also not very versatile for different worship experiences. Flags in the sanctuary came up with as many in favor of the flags as against them. The same holds true for the location of fellowship treats after worship-some like them in the Dining Room while just as many liked it in the Gathering Place. A common complaint among all groups was that much of the work is done by many of the same people volunteering their time. Shared worship and ministry spaces came up often, as it is difficult to use space that is not dedicated to just one ministry, as many of our spaces are.

When asked what the needs of the community are, there was great consensus around the following: a need for more children and youth programs, affordable and accessible housing for all ages and disabilities, concern for those in struggling marriages, the homeless, the hungry, and transportation for the elderly.

When asked what the Tipton First UMC is known for in the community, Shared Blessings came up first every time. That was followed by our children's and youth ministries and willingness to be in the community. The quality music offerings at the church was also a plus that was shared.

Then the groups had the chance to dream. I asked: If there were no limitations of money, time, people, etc., what would you like to see the church do and/or be? Here is what was shared: A space for Christian Chaos and the Chancel Choir to share musically on the same Sunday. Hire an organist, sanctuary repair, handicapped accessible altar area, and bat abatement, add staff, hire a youth director, and more young people in choir. Increase advertising budget and put in an outside LED sign. Add a shower so mission groups may stay as well as a washer and dryer installed to do laundry of the church. A new sound system with better hearing assist is needed. A slide thru dishwasher installed in the kitchen and electronic locks on doors. Handicapped accessible everywhere in and out of the church, including a larger elevator so caskets can ride up to sanctuary at funerals. Have a drive up space to the door on the east for accessibility, including an overhang for weather. More parking spaces, including handicapped. There is a desire for rooms painted with brighter colors, TV's in lower level for groups, more space on Sunday morning during the education hour, and a bus with air conditioning.

Then there were the dreams that were more ministry related: Emphasize quality in all areas of the church, and to figure out ways to connect youth beyond confirmation. Create an after school program and extend/expand Preschool to include a daycare program. Do connectional things with other churches, especially an overseas mission trip. There is a desire that all will offer to serve and more will be in ministry at the church, instead of just worshipping on Sunday. Speaking of worship, there were a few who would like an alternative worship experience on a different day and/or time in an alternative setting. What would it look like if we expanded our youth ministry and also offered a parent night out ministry? How about a clothing pantry and expanded food pantry days and hours? There are those who would love it if a Men's group began to meet again, more GIGs, homework assistance, and a Mother's group during the day.

If you would like to see the entire list, I have copies available in the office. Again, thanks for the insight into who you are and what your dreams are.
